Mission: FPF's reason for existence

Front Porch Forum's mission is to help neighbors connect and build community, thereby increasing local resilience. We do that by hosting a network of online local forums covering all of Vermont, where neighbors share postings and engage about a wide variety of topics. We further our mission by providing other features, such as our paid ads, directory and community calendar. The resulting increase in social capital and community cohesion benefits neighbors, government, local businesses, nonprofits and local media.

Vision: How communities we serve, and FPF itself, will appear in the future

FPF's vision is of thriving and resilient communities that consistently demonstrate a commitment to a shared future. These communities are filled with informed residents who know, support, and trust their neighbors without regard to their political affiliation, organize with neighbors in support of community goals, participate in local democratic processes, value and rely on local journalism, support area nonprofits, and spend their money with local businesses. Our vision for FPF itself is as critical civic infrastructure for every community in our coverage area, with an ownership, governance and financial model that supports this work for many generations to come.

FPF 2022 accomplishments

Front Porch Forum continued to serve its social mission and the communities of Vermont. This work continued even through a highly charged political climate nationally and throughout the state. Nearly every community in Vermont debated Proposal 5 "Right to Personal Reproductive Autonomy Amendment" for months leading up to the November 2022 election. This exceptionally difficult topic taken on during such a divisive political time was reflected through FPF postings and related feedback.

In response to these challenges, FPF continued to evolve our posting moderation model and member policies. We also added staff members to better handle increasing load, and invested in our staff training.

During 2022, FPF's service grew on many fronts, including:

- Members (for every 1,000 households in VT, FPF has 800 members)
- Postings submitted by members
- Email Forums sent to members
- Directory listings
- Calendar events
- Forum and Directory searches
- Ads for local businesses displayed in Forums
- Website pageviews
- Active users of mobile app
